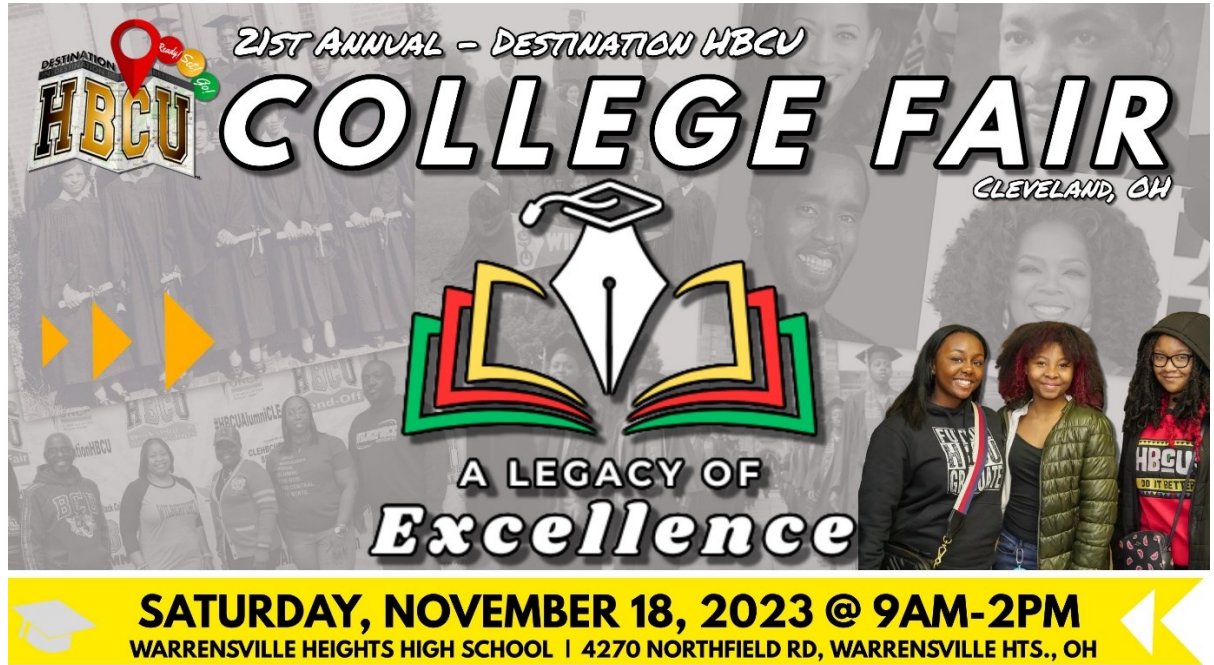

The Destination:

The Cleveland Council of Black Colleges Alumni Association is responsible for organizing this exceptional group made up of graduates and supporters of accredited HBCUs in the Greater Cleveland area. This event attracts admissions offices, major sponsors, and national recognition, making it a comprehensive and renowned experience on multiple levels.

At the fair, high school seniors and college transfer students will have the opportunity to complete the Common Black College Application, allowing them to apply to more than 60 HBCUs with just one submission. They may also receive immediate acceptance and scholarship offers. Furthermore, attendees will have the chance to interact with vendors and take part in workshops that cover a wide range of topics.

- Career & College Readiness: organizations that offer scholarship opportunities and employment, internships, training, and development.
- Youth Programming: athletic programs, recreational groups and programs, and other agencies that provide educational services, after-school programming, mentoring, social/emotional learning, and development.
- Health and Wellness: for health and wellness groups that aim to promote a better lifestyle. Such groups can focus on active lifestyles, clean eating, available programs, and much more.
- Community Service: offer community service opportunities.
- Social Service: providing services and programs to support the total well-being of the family.

Featured HBCU:

In a matter of weeks, we will announce the prestigious HBCU that will take center stage. It is our tradition to bestow extra attention to a chosen institution every year. This exclusive partnership guarantees prominent promotion prior to the event, exclusive placement at the fair, and an esteemed invitation for the college or university president to lead the panel discussion. The institution will also enjoy increased exposure through media releases, speaking opportunities, and engagement from their various groups such as the band, choir, and cheerleaders.

Student/Parent Participants:

The fair welcomes high school students and parents from Warrensville Heights High School, Cleveland Metropolitan School District, and neighboring school districts. Parents, counselors, youth leaders, and interested individuals are encouraged to attend. Admission is free for all attendees, but students must register. Additionally, community colleges in the area (Cuyahoga Community College, Lakeland Community College, and Lorain County Community College) will be invited to meet college transfer students. Please visit the website for updates on participating schools and programs.

Students represent many public/private/parochial/charter school districts in the Greater Cleveland area. However, our reach goes far beyond that, as in years past, we have had participants attend from all parts of Ohio, Buffalo, NY; Detroit, MI; Pittsburgh, PA; Wheeling, WV; and Niagara Falls & Ontario, CA.

What We Expect:

The main exhibit hall will be in the gymnasium of the respective buildings or a classroom space on Saturday. Various workshops will be held in designated classrooms on Saturday. Through your participation we hope that you will be able to certainly engage each student and parent to want to know more about your institution. Even more, we desire that as the representative of your organization, you will:

- Set up a table to discuss recruitment options and admissions requirements.
- Distribute information on scholarship options or youth-related educational programs.
- Offer or accept application fee waivers for eligible students.
- Engage scholars and parents with options, opportunities, and resources related post-secondary options, careers, internship, and vocational interest.
- **In addition, all institutions, alumni groups, and organizations are asked to donate 2 to 4 items representing your school/organization/program to be used as door prizes throughout the fair (for each day). Items could range from t-shirts, bags, novelty items, gift cards, etc.**

HBCU Participants, Amenities & Registration:

To participate, you must be:

- An Admissions or Alumni Representative or administrator of an accredited institution designated a Historically Black College or University.
- Alumni reps and chapters, please consult with your alma mater about their participation to avoid double registration.
- Institutions can opt to have a classroom space on Saturday to host prospective students. This space can be used as a "One-Stop Shop" where you can host in-depth orientation sessions, auditions, a financial aid corner, ROTC presentations, alumni meet-ups, and more. To decorate the classroom with your school colors, and let the good times roll.

1. Set up may begin as early as 7:00 am on Saturday.
 - You can also set up Friday evening beginning at 3pm for classrooms and the for general exhibit hall areas.
2. Representatives will receive specific information regarding check-in, entrances, and parking the week of the event.
3. You will receive your table assignment at the fair entrance. Please be sure to check in.
4. Volunteers will be available to assist with location and set-up.
5. Each table is, at a minimum, a six-foot table with approximately one foot on either side.
6. It is highly encouraged that you drape/decorate your table with a tablecloth reflective of your institution/organization.
7. The table and/or classroom should be aesthetically pleasing and allow space for students to complete inquiry cards, applications, etc.
8. All setups need to be completed by the time we begin the opening session.
