# CLEVELAND HBCU ALUMNI ALONG WITH FIRSTENERGY CELEBRATES MORE THAN 100 COLLEGE-BOUND STUDENTS WITH NEARLY \$20,000 IN SCHOLARSHIPS & PRIZES

Cleveland, OH – On what was a beautiful sunny Sunday afternoon (June 30, 2019) the Cleveland Council of Black Colleges Alumni Association along with the United Negro College Fund presented the 7<sup>th</sup> Annual FirstEnergy Destination HBCU: Student Send-off at the Cleveland Metroparks, South Chagrin Reservations – Shelterhouse. More than 150 students and parents along with alumni representing the various Historically Black Colleges and Universities were in attendance.

The send-off is designed for all Cleveland area college-bound freshmen students and upperclassmen returning to a Historically Black College or University in the fall of 2019. The send-off is the closing activity of the council's annual commitment to providing wraparound educational support services to aid students to reach the "Destination HBCU" of their choice. Through this event and with the support of some generous partners and donors, the alumni group is able to continue to do the work in the name of their individual and collective institutions.

Each year, the group host an annual HBCU College Fair, which attracts nearly 5,000 participants from the greater Cleveland community and beyond – reaching as far as Ontario, Canada. The ultimate intent of the fair is to increase college enrollment among under-served and underrepresented youth. This event is followed by the "I've Been Accepted, Now What?" workshop to support students and parents through the financial aid and scholarship preparation process. Finally, during the summer the alums celebrate the graduation and enrollment to the HBCU.

### The goals of the send-off are to:

- Introduce the incoming freshman student and parent(s) to alumni and other current students of the prospective institution,
- Build relationships and capacity with other HBCU students in their respective region, and
- Create a network of resources at the campus level and in the respective community of the institution.

According to Anthony H. Brown (Bethune-Cookman University), Council President, "We plan to enjoy this awesome event to celebrate the importance of HBCUs and the next generation of students." He continues to say, "We want to send or return them to college with all of the positive support and encouragement from our community."

This year marked the first time involvement with the FirstEnergy Foundation as the title sponsor. Lorna Wisham, Vice President, Corporate Affairs & Community Involvement shares, "The FirstEnergy Foundation is honored to partner with the Cleveland Council of Black Colleges Alumni Association for this annual event. We plan to sustain our relationship with the council by supporting future events. FirstEnergy hopes to become an employer of choice for the students and their families."

During this cookout, the alumni council acknowledged the selected 2019 scholarship recipients of the UNCF Northern Ohio Scholars Program and the Anthony H. Brown HBCU Arts Scholar. In addition to the scholarships, totaling \$11,000, many of the registered students received a footlocker/trunk filled with toiletries and other dormitory room needs, care packages and a variety of gift cards.
